#### **ACTIVITY SUGGESTIONS**

#### Škoda Rallye

A nice and entertaining car ride out in the Czech country with cars from the 1980s and 1990s - namely in the Škoda 100 and Škoda 120. The participants will drive themselves. The race starts on the outskirts of Prague. Our instructors welcome all participants and explain how the competition will take place. Each car has a crew of four people. The cars have the company's logo placed on the doors. All crews are equipped with a car map with the race distance marked, GPS navigation, digital camera and mobile phone. The goal of the



competition is to drive a distance of 40-50 km, meanwhile the crews have to solve various tasks, photograph various objects, buildings, go to shops and shop and contact "natives". In the middle of the competition there will be a stop for refreshments. There is no timing during the competition, the winner will be the team that collects the most points.

#### City walk

Shorter version, just walk without bus - about 2 hours. Here we will see, among other things, a. the world famous Astrological Clock which is the major tourist attraction. The square also has a very extensive and interesting history through the centuries. On the side of the square there is another well-visited place - the Jewish city with five beautiful synagogues and a large cemetery. We also have time to see the historic building Klementinum, which includes the National Library and



the Chapel of Mirrors where W.A. Mozart used to play the organ during his visits to the city. Then we head towards the world-famous Charles Bridge, which is one of Europe's oldest bridges (included in the UNESCO World Heritage List). Swedish-speaking guide. ### **Beer brewery Velke Popovice**

The brewery is located in the village of Velké Popovice near Prague. The first notes about the brewery can already be found in the first half of the 16th century, where there is talk of beer of the highest quality. After the Thirty Years' War, the brewery was managed by the church. In 1785, ownership passed into private hands and in 1870 the brewery was bought by František Ringhoffer, a well-known industrial magnate who rebuilt the facility into a state-of-the-art brewery with advanced technology. The beer was officially named "Kozel" (The Goat). In 1948,



the brewery was nationalized. After 1989 it became privately owned again. In March 1999, the company was bought by the Pilsner Urquell group and is now part of the South African Breweries group. The beer brand Kozel has a great reputation in the world and has won several international competitions, including a. first beer - WC in the pilsner beer class.

#### **PRAGUE BEER MUSEUM**

Beer tasting at the Prague Beer Museum. Czech beer is world famous, Czechs drink, according to

statistics, the most beer in the world per inhabitant. However, most restaurants or pubs rarely offer more than two types of beer. More than 30 different types of beer are served at the Beer Museum. Two-hour lecture on the history of beer, how to brew beer, which ingredients were used, and in the meantime, the participants get to try 7 types of beer with varying strengths and flavors. Of course, substantial snacks are also served with the beer. In the middle of the talk, a small break is made to also taste real beer goulash. During the beer tasting, they discuss how the different types of beer taste, and in that way the participants get an insight into Czech beer culture



and find out facts about the beer that they may not have known before. The beer tasting ends with all participants receiving a case with 2 bottles of the Öl museum's special beer as a gift.

The beer tasting of 7 types of beer with goulash, sausages and cheese takes 2 hours. As a gift you get a bag with 2 pcs. beer with him. Story in Swedish about the history of Czech beer on site.
